Freddie's fight with aids

Mercury was diagnosed with AIDS in 1987. Despite his declining health, he continued performing with his characteristically electrifying stage presence. He disclosed his condition on November 23, 1991. He would pass away just one day later, on November 24. In the years that followed, the remaining members of Queen and other musicians raised millions for AIDS research in Mercury's memory, organizing tribute concerts and establishing charities.
